Dear Sir or Madam,

You can only participate in the Covid-19 mass testing programme using rapid antigen tests if you give us your **voluntary and written** consent to the storage and processing of your personal data. If you do not give us your consent, you will not be able to get tested under the mass testing programme.

By completing this form, you give your explicit consent to the processing of the following personal data for the purpose of carrying out a coronavirus antigen test:

*The personal data of legal representatives is processed on the basis of the respectively applicable laws (ABGB for legal guardians of minors, child and youth welfare laws, laws on adult dependent relatives etc.).*

The test involves taking a cell sample and storing the above data alongside data on the epidemiological evaluation, a sample identifier (allowing clear identification of the sample source), a department-specific personal ID, and the test result (positive or negative) in the screening programme register of the Federal Ministry. Positive test results are also saved in the epidemiological reporting system and forwarded to the competent healthcare authorities.

You will receive your test result by email or phone.

The testing and storage process involves other organisations (municipalities, the Austrian Armed Forces, emergency services, IT service providers), which will also receive your data to the extent required.

All processed data are secured against unauthorised third-party access and deleted immediately after they have fulfilled their purpose. In the event of a negative test result, the data will be stored for 4 weeks so that any queries may be answered. You can withdraw your consent at any time by emailing [tiroltestet@tirol.gv.at](mailto:tiroltestet@tirol.gv.at). The data processing activities that have been completed up to your withdrawal of consent will not be affected. In the event of a positive test result, the withdrawal of your consent will not have any legal effect, as the law governing epidemics stipulates a report to the healthcare authority, which will lead to further measures under the same law (subsequent PCR test, quarantine etc.).

Your rights include the right of access, rectification and erasure of your data.  
You also have the right to raise an objection to the data protection authority.
